9. Learning outcomes of the course unit: The course in Web Design and Multimedia Part II aims to build further knowledge of building a web site. Students acquire basics of Cascading Style Sheets - CSS and their appliance in creating web sites with Adobe Dreamweaver software. Students learn techniques to promote sites in search engines (SEO) as well as Google - Webmaster tools.

11. Prerequisites and co-requisites: Students need to have basic knowledge of web design and ability to work with Adobe Dreamweaver software, obtained in the course Web Design and Multimedia Part I.

XHTML, HTML 5.0; Cascading Style Sheets (CSS) - Introduction; CSS Classes; Text formatting with CSS; Adobe Dreamweaver - implementation of Cascading Style Sheets; External style sheets attachment; Create new Cascading Style Sheets rules, change properties; Adobe Dreamweaver – Placement of CSS elements on a Webpage - creating div elements, exporting styles; Site optimization.
