Learning outcomes of the course unit: postgraduates acquire *knowledge about*: the problems and prospects for Black Sea cooperation; EU policy in the Black Sea region; *abilities*: to identify and analyze current issues of synergy between the Black Sea cooperation and the Bulgarian development priorities; to formulate and give reasons for their own positions on the role of Bulgaria in the Black Sea cooperation.
