9. Learning outcomes of the course unit: To acquaint students with the genesis of the comparative fundamentalism and general characteristics of the radical Islamic fundamentalism.
10. Mode of delivery: face-to-face
11. Prerequisites and co-requisites: Students should have done a test or an interview.
12. Course contents: It is divided into four main sections: A. Comparative fundamentalism which discusses the parameters of fundamentalism in the three monotheistic religions - Christianity, Judaism and Islam. B. Genesis of fundamentalism which involves an analysis of the individual components of the phenomenon. C. Party and political fundamentalism which outlines the main subjects of this ideology. D. State fundamentalism which analyzes the status of radical Islam in the three leading countries in the Islamic world - Iran, Saudi Arabia and Turkey.
