Learning outcomes of the course unit: The objective of the course is to give students a thorough, basic theoretical knowledge about the nature of terrorism; to reveal the logic of building a system of measures to counteract it. It provides the necessary knowledge and skills for organizing and carrying out a complex of activities connected with the advance preparation and immediate implementation of measures to counteract terrorism.
10. Mode of delivery: face-to-face.
11. Prerequisites and co-requisites: Students are required to have knowledge of the following courses: Constitutional Law, Administrative Law and Process, Criminal Procedural Law, International and National Security and Theory of Intelligence and Counterintelligence.
12. Course unit contents: The course presents in a well ordered and logical system the theoretically applied aspects of the counteraction to terrorism; it also discusses the social and political essence of terrorism, its genesis and tendencies for development. The contents focuses is on the prevention of terrorist activities through a system of measures with legal and special character. Problems connected with the coordination and cooperation among special services and other state and public structures in their counteraction to terrorism are also discussed.
